Jack Ma or Ma Yun was born on October 15, 1964, in Hangzhou, located in the southeastern part of China. He has an older brother and a younger sister. His family didn't have much money when they were young. Even though Ma was skinny, (1)

he often got into fights with classmates. After US president Richard Nixon visited Hangzhou in 1972, Ma's hometown became a tourist center. As a teenager, Ma started visiting the city's main hotel, offering visitors city tours in **exchange** for English lessons. The nickname "Jack" was given to him by a tourist he befriended. After high school, he applied to college but failed the admission exam twice. He finally passed on the third try and attended Hangzhou Teacher's Institute. He graduated in 1988 and started applying for many jobs. He received more than a dozen **rejections** before being hired as an English teacher. During his first trip to the US in 1995, Ma was **impressed** by the internet. Ma's first online search was "beer," but he was surprised that no Chinese beers turned up in the results. It was then that he decided to **found** an internet company for China. Four years later he **convinced** 17 of his friends to invest in online marketplace that he called "Alibaba."



"Alibaba" allowed people to post products that customers could buy directly. The service started to attract members from all over the world. By October 1999, the company had **raised** \$5 million from Goldman Sachs and \$20 million from SoftBank, a Japanese telecom. In the early

2000s, the company decided to start Taobao, its eBay **competitor**. In 2005, Yahoo invested \$1 billion in Alibaba in exchange for about a 40%

\$150-billion IPO (Initial Public Offering). This made Ma the richest man in China, with an estimated worth of \$25 billion. Ma told employees at a press conference that he hopes they use their wealth to become genuinely noble people who are able to help others and to be kind and	0)
